

TESTICULAR CANCER

IS THE MOST COMMON CANCER IN

MALES 15-75 YEARS OLD

HEALTH ALERT

Testicular Cancer is the most common type of cancer in men ages 15-75 years, but men of All ages can be at risk. Testicular cancer is of special concern to young men. Its less common in middle-aged and older men. Caucasian men are about 5 times more likely to develop testicular cancer than African American men. The rate among Hispanic men lies between those of African Americans and Caucasians.

In the US, over 8,500 cases are diagnosed each year, and almost 400 males die of testicular cancer. According to the American Cancer Society, the average age of diagnosis is about the age of 33. Most testicular cancer awareness organizations recommend that males conduct regular self exams. Consult your health care provider if you have any questions.
